Pottery

For Adults

Adult pottery classes are available for beginners and intermediates. The curriculum covers hand-building, wheel-throwing, glaze application, and decorative technique on high-fired stoneware. Only pots made with clay supplied by Wesleyan Potters can be fired in our kilns. Clay and tools cost extra, but glaze materials and firing are included. Classes meet on holidays unless otherwise noted.

Jewelry

Our courses are designed to accommodate both beginners and advanced students, covering all the fundamental techniques of jewelry making, including sawing, filing, soldering, texturing, and patina coloring. Individual attention ensures that students can progress at their own pace. Those with prior experience will have the opportunity to select their own projects. Materials are extra. An optional one hour bench time will be available for Wednesday morning, Friday, and Saturday morning classes for a \$5 fee per session.

Students will work in our spacious studio and explore the exciting world of pottery, creating both functional and decorative pieces using techniques like pinching, coiling, extruding, and slab construction.

Youth hand-building classes introduce surface design methods such as stamping, carving, and rolling out patterns with materials, lace and natural objects. Children will have the opportunity to add vibrant colors using underglazes and finish their work with a clear glaze.

This engaging and educational experience is perfect for nurturing children's artistic talents and providing them with a fun and enriching after-school activity.
